Scholarship Agreement - 2024-2025

This scholarship agreement is entered into between Regent's International School, Bangkok and the student named below.

1. Purpose of the Scholarship

At Regent's, scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate the potential to achieve outstanding performance as well-rounded leaders of the future.

Scholarships are a mutually beneficial arrangement. Financial discounts are awarded in exchange for the commitment from the student, and their family, to fully support the school's purpose and to promote the school as much as possible.

The award of a scholarship is conditional upon the fulfilment of the scholarship criteria and adhering to the expectation of confidentiality, as outlined below.

2. Scholarship Criteria

To maintain eligibility for this scholarship, the student and their family, agree to meet the following criteria:

- a. Make a positive contribution to the school community through active participation in extracurricular activities, volunteerism, or leadership roles.
 - i. The behaviour record of the student should demonstrate excellent conduct.
 - ii. The student should be able to evidence participation in school events and activities
 - iii. The student should also demonstrate their contribution to the school as a well-rounded individual, through the Round Square IDEALS.



- b. Demonstrate diligence and commitment to academic pursuits by consistently striving to meet their academic potential.
 - i. Academic achievement should be in line with the expectations of the student.
 - ii. The completion of out of lesson work, including homework, should be consistent and to a high standard.
 - iii. Where appropriate, be preparing to apply to high quality universities.
- c. Maintain excellent attendance and punctuality throughout the academic year.
 - i. High levels of punctuality with no more than 5 lates.
 - ii. 95% or better attendance (except for authorised attendance at events related to the scholarship).
 - iii. No unauthorised absence.
- d. Represent the school in external events and competitions.
 - i. In any event which is related to the scholarship, the name of the school must be prominently displayed and mentioned.
 - ii. Mention the name of the school in personal social media posts about events.
 - iii. Where allowed and appropriate, wear the school uniform, including blazer, at events related to the scholarship.
- e. If applicable, contribute positively to the boarding community by fostering a supportive and inclusive environment.
 - i. Actively participate in boarding events and activities during the week and at weekends.
 - ii. Organise at least two activities for boarders per term.
 - iii. Ensure that the expectation of being present during the entire term is fulfilled. Specifically, not leaving before the end of term and arriving before the beginning of term.

3. Specific Targets

In addition to the general criteria outlined above, the recipient is expected to achieve the following specific targets:

- Complete additional acts of service in the school by supporting ELD students with their language development (minimum 20 hours during the year).
- Participate in or organise 5 Round Square events with other schools during the year.

4. Rights and Responsibilities

The school agrees to provide the recipient with the specified scholarship amount for the duration outlined in this agreement. The student and their family agree to fulfil all obligations outlined in this agreement and to represent the school with dignity and respect.



5. Expectation of Graduation

It is the expectation of the school that students awarded a scholarship make a commitment to remaining in the school until they graduate at the end of Year 13. This is to ensure that both the student and the school gain the maximum benefit from the investment made.

In exceptional circumstances, the school and the family may agree to an earlier withdrawal from the school. However, the school reserves the right to recover the scholarship amount for up to the final year of membership of the school.

6. Confidentiality

This agreement is considered confidential between the student, their immediate family, and the school.

Any disclosure of the details of this agreement, specifically the scholarship amount or specific criteria, will be considered a significant breach of confidentiality and any scholarship (existing or future) will be immediately terminated.

7. Dispute Resolution

Any disputes arising under this agreement shall be communicated through the Principal and be resolved by the scholarship committee.

8. Signatures

Both parties acknowledge that they have read and understood the terms of this agreement and agree to abide by them.
