Aiden has settled into Term 2 so well. He confidently enters the classroom every morning saying 'Good morning!'. He has become much more social towards his peers. He is beginning to cooperatively play with his peers during moments of the day. He still enjoys spending most of his time with his teachers. He is a great help and enjoys helping his teachers set up activities and have a say in what we should do. His communication has developed dramatically, he now speaks to Ms Pha and myself in full English sentences. His vocabulary is developing and enhancing all of the time. Aiden enjoys asking questions and being involved in all classroom discussions, even when he is not included he enjoys observing. His physical development is well on track. He is beginning to be able to hold the pencils more securely, with the help from small hand muscle activities such as threading and dough disco.

Aiden has been using his listening skills to become more aware of the sounds around him. He is now focusing on making sounds and patterns using both instruments and body percussion; for example, clapping and stamping his feet. He is beginning to understand the concept of more and fewer with support, by counting two sets and comparing the numbers. Aiden enjoyed learning about our inspirational woman Amelia Earhart, he especially enjoyed showing his plane he made with mummy during our Show and Tell session. At times Aiden joins in with singing and dancing in the classroom, but often needs prompting to do so.

Aiden loves Clubs this term. He especially enjoys taekwondo and football club.

Aiden has made good progress in recognising Thai alphabet letters and Thai numbers from 1 to 5. He tries his best to write Thai alphabet letters and Thai

numbers in order to gain his proficiency. He has good listening skills and is quick to answer questions from Thai stories confidently. He is always actively involved in class activities and completes his work in time and with enjoyment. For his next step, Aiden should continue practising tracing the Thai alphabet letters constantly in order to develop good handwriting skills.

Aiden continues to be a happy member of music class and has made progress this term. His participation levels have improved although he can sometimes be distracted, particularly in movement activities. However, his vocal skills have really developed and he is beginning to sing with greater clarity. We will continue to work on these skills and I look forward to seeing Aiden continue to make progress next term.

Continue to extend his concentration time period.

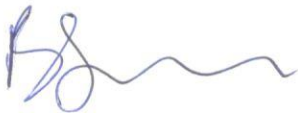
Build secure friendships with his peers through playing alongside them more regularly throughout the day.
