Classteacher Comment:

Aiden is a friendly and hardworking student who actively engages in class lessons, demonstrating a commendable enthusiasm for learning. He participates in discussions and raises his hand, reflecting his positive attitude and love for learning. In Mathematics, he has shown significant improvement in adding and subtracting across a 10, showcasing a solid foundation in these mathematical concepts. In addition, continued practice in division by sharing into equal groups will contribute to his mathematical proficiency. In English, he produced a good innovative version of Jack and the Beanstalk. However, it is recommended that he takes the time to review and edit his writing, checking for capital letters and full stops. To further strengthen his phonics skills, it would be beneficial for him to practice and review phase 5 sounds and actively attempt blending unfamiliar words while reading. In Thai, he is making good progress in reading and writing skills. He still has opportunities for improvement. Occasionally, his handwriting may stray outside the lines, and some letters appear less consistent than others. However, encouraging continued focus on these areas will help him achieve greater consistency and precision in his writing. In IPC, he has showcased great creative abilities, producing an excellent timeline about celebrations in his life, reflecting engagement with learning about celebrations around the world. With continued effort and support, he has the potential for further growth and success throughout Year 2.

In Mathematics, practise division problems

Pupils' attainment is compared to the expectations for their year group. Attainment is graded in the following bands:

GD = At Greater Depth: Pupils working beyond the standard expected for their year group, showing greater depth of understanding.

ME = Meeting Expectations: Pupils who are working at the standard expected for their year group.

WT = Are Working Towards: Pupils working at the appropriate age curriculum, but who have not yet secured all the expected learning for their year group.

BE = Below Expectations: Pupils who are not yet working on the objectives linked to their year group.

Pupils' effort is measured against St. Stephen's high expectations; it is graded in the following bands:

1 = Excellent Effort. The student achieving this grade will have produced work close to the highest standard of which he/she is capable. A considerable amount of time will have been spent on this work.

2 = Good effort. The student achieving this grade will have shown care and attention in producing his/her work. There would be some room for improvement, given a greater effort.

3 = Average effort. The student achieving this grade will have produced the required work to a basically acceptable standard (for his/her ability), but without ever extending him/herself beyond this.

4 = Disappointing effort. The student achieving this grade will have generally made little attempt to complete the work set, and will have shown a reluctance to respond to advice. This pupil's work may be poorly presented and lacking in punctuality.

5 = Highly unsatisfactory effort. The student achieving this grade will have made virtually no attempt to complete (or even start) the work set. how the student can progress in each subject

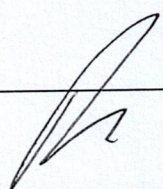
Attendance Explanation

Concerning	Attendance is below 90% or frequently late to school.

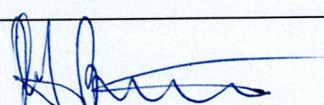
Behaviour = EXCEPTIONAL
